

EISTEDDFOD TRALLONG 2023

Braf oedd gweld cystadleuwyr cyson fel Jennifer Drew Parry, Efan Williams, Sophie Davies, Ann Watkins, David Maybury, Maria Evans, Dyfed Watkins, Angharad Jones, Gerwyn Rhys, Emyr Evans, Marc Williams a Sian Norgate ymhlith enillwyr y noson.

Ein beirniaid oedd Mr Alistair O'Mahoney o Gastell Nedd (cerddoriaeth) a Miss Ruth Lloyd o Lanilltyd Fawr, yn wreiddiol o Lanwrtyd, a fu'n beirniadu'r adrannau llefaru llwyfan, yn ogystal â'r adrannau llenyddiaeth hŷn. Cafwyd cefnogaeth dda iawn yn yr adrannau yma, a dywedodd y beirniad ei bod wedi cymryd dau ddiwrnod cyfan iddi ddarllen y cynigion.

The 2023 Trallong Eisteddfod took place on the first weekend of November in Maescar Hall, Sennybridge and was again a great success. Nine excellent soloists battled it out in the Champion Solo competition – the eventual winner being Barry Powell from Llanfihangel Y Creuddyn, a new competitor on this particular stage. Second Prize was awarded to Robert Jenkins of Llanfihangel Yr Arth, another new competitor. The Male Solo was won by Gwyn Morris from Cardigan, yet another new competitor at this event. It was pleasing to see regular competitors such as Jennifer Drew Parry, Efan Williams, Sophie Davies, Ann Watkins, David Maybury, Maria Evans, Dyfed Watkins, Angharad Jones, Gerwyn Rhys, Emyr Evans, Marc Williams and Sian Norgate among the evening winners. We were delighted that Aberhonddu Male Voice Choir were able to join us, as they had had a busy day performing at our MP's wedding earlier in the day.

In the Children's classes the winner of the Mrs Mary Price trophy for the competitor showing the most potential in the local classes was Carys Lewis, Llwyntew, competing for the very first time – well done Carys.

The Mr. Alec Tompkins Perpetual Miniature Chair for the competitor showing the most potential in the open classes was won by Elan Mabbutt of Aberystwyth, a regular competitor for a number of years. The Mrs. Margaret Rees Perpetual Shield for the instrumental solo 12 years and under was won by Ed Edwards of Llandrindod Wells.

Our adjudicators were Mr. Alistair O'Mahoney of Neath (music) and Miss Ruth Lloyd of Llanilltyd Fawr, originally from Llanwrtyd Wells, who adjudicated the stage recitation classes in addition to the senior literature classes. These latter classes were very well supported, and she remarked that it had taken her two whole days just to read through the entries.

The Children's Art and Literature classes were judged by Mrs. Tracey Havard of Defynnog, who made encouraging and constructive suggestions for future competitions.

The Presidents for the day were Mrs. Elin Mabbutt of Aberystwyth and Mr. Gareth Wyn-Thomas of Capel Hendre. Both gave interesting addresses with much food for thought. Our very talented accompanists this year were Mrs. Bethan Thomas of Crossgates and Miss Rhiannon Pritchard of Cardiff. This was Rhiannon's first visit to us and she was presented with a large number of challenging copies to play at first sight.

The conductors were Mrs. Elaine Pye of Trallong, Mrs. Mary Hodges of Cardiff, Mrs. Bethan Price of Defynnog, Mr. Marc Williams of Sennybridge and Mr. Dyfed Watkins of Trecastle – they all did an amazing job in keeping the competitions flowing.

The champion solo 18 to 30 years Perpetual Cup given by the family of the late Mrs. Hyral Thomas in her memory was won by Sophie Davies of Aberbran.

Other prize-winners in the children's stage items included Lowri and Ffion Astington (Llanfihangel-Nant-Bran), Jake and Ryan Morgan (Heol Senni), Evie Lewis (Llwyntew) and Ioan Mabbutt (Aberystwyth).

Winners in the children's Art and Literature classes included Ffion & Lowri Astington, Ffion Thomas (Llandrindod Wells), and Eva May, Betsan, Neila, Lexi, Molly, A.L., Jasper, E.V.M, Emily, Mair and Holly all pupils of Ysgol y Mynydd Du in Talgarth.
